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This directory is published and updated by New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NHHFA) as a guide to rent-assisted housing in the state. It lists the housing developments which are currently subsidized with funding from either the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), Rural Development (RD), or NHHFA through permanent financing or rental assistance payment mechanisms.

This directory lists the total number of units in the project and the number of units specifically targeted to very low or low-income households either through rent subsidies or income and rent restrictions. In addition, it lists the administering agency, the program through which the project was funded or created, and rental subsidy programs associated with each development.

This directory does not include information on the Section 8 Existing Housing Program, which provides rental assistance to individual households through the rental vouchers and certificates. For questions about this program, call or email NHHFA using the contact information below.

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DISCRIMINATION IN HOUSING

Discrimination on the basis of race, color, age, familial status, religion, sex, marital status, national origin, or physical or mental handicap, in housing at any property is against the law. There are no exceptions.

All of the following are types of discrimination:

- 1. Setting different terms or conditions for different people in renting property.
- 2. Advertising housing in a discriminating way: For example, "Men only," or "No Children."
- 3. Denying that a place is available for rent or inspection when, in fact, it is available.

The New Hampshire Commission for Human Rights has the authority to investigate charges of discrimination and correct any cases of discrimination in housing. If you have questions or would like to file a complaint, contact:

DESIGNATION OF HOUSING TYPE BY "AGE RESTRICTED" OR "GENERAL OCCUPANCY"

Projects in this directory have been classified as "Age Restricted" and "General Occupancy." The term **Age Restricted** refers to the HUD definition of an elderly household: a household whose head or spouse or sole member is elderly, or a person with disabilities. It may include two or more elderly persons, persons with disabilities living together, or one or more of these persons living with one or more live-in aides. Any household whose head or spouse or sole member is younger than 62 years old, but meets this definition in some other way, is eligible to apply for housing assistance.

DEFINITION OF ACCESSIBLE UNITS

A list of typical characteristics of accessible units was used as a guideline in identifying these units because there are many characteristics that can make a unit "accessible." These characteristics included, but were not limited to: roll-in showers; grab bars in the bathroom and shower areas; wiring to accommodate strobe lights for the hearing impaired; flush interior / exterior thresholds; hallways wide enough to accommodate wheelchair turns; 5-feet turning space in bathrooms and kitchens, lever door knobs; accessible low-level cabinets; accessible appliances; low level light switches; and rounded counter top edges.

During data collection, respondents to the census used their own judgment to determine whether a unit was accessible. Therefore, not all of the "accessible units" contain the features listed. You should contact the property management company to obtain specific information regarding the accessible characteristics for each unit.

The directory is organized by county and community, and lists the housing developments which are currently subsidized with funding from either the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Rural Development, or New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority through permanent financing or rental assistance payment mechanisms

OTHER NOTES

The use of the words "assisted housing" or "assisted units" in this directory does not mean that all the housing units listed here are intended for tenants requiring assistance in the activities of daily living (cooking, cleaning, shopping, etc.). Rather, "assisted" in the context of this directory means that the housing facilities listed here have been or are being provided subsidies for the purpose of creating affordable units for low and very low-income households.
