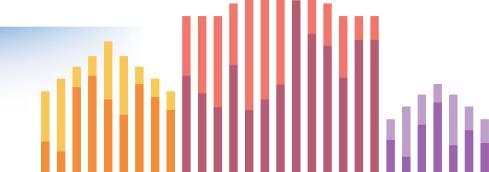

Housing Choice Voucher Program

HUD Names NH Housing a Moving to Work Agency

- Reduce costs and achieve greater administrative flexibilities
- Give incentives to families who become economically self-sufficient
- Increase housing choices for eligible low-income families

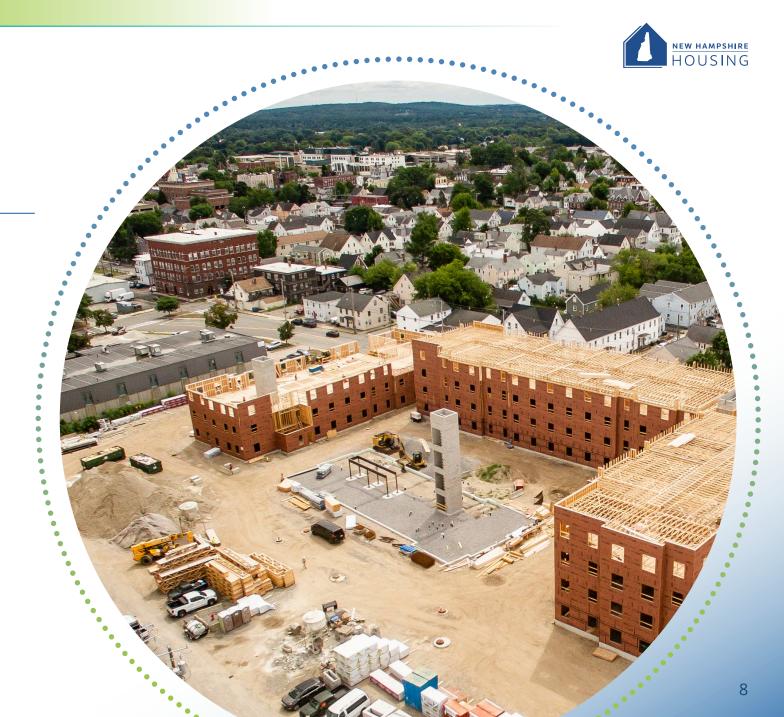
Two new programs will begin in early 2024 to meet objectives

- CASH Creating Assets through Saving Habits:
 500 participants randomly selected and enrolled over a 24-month period.
 Each household will have \$25 per month deposited into an escrow savings account.
- STEPS Striving Towards Economic and Personal Success:
 Combines Housing Choice Voucher assistance with education and support for families who want to increase their earned income



MULTIFAMILY HOUSING DIVISION

We finance construction, acquisition and preservation of affordable rental housing for families, individuals of all ages, and people who need supportive housing services (substance use disorders, veterans, transitional)

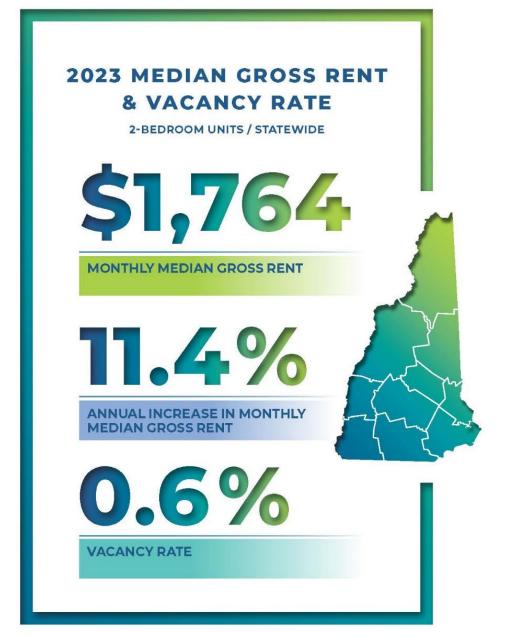
- Almost 60,000 units between 2020 and 2030
- Nearly 90,000 units between 2020 and 2040





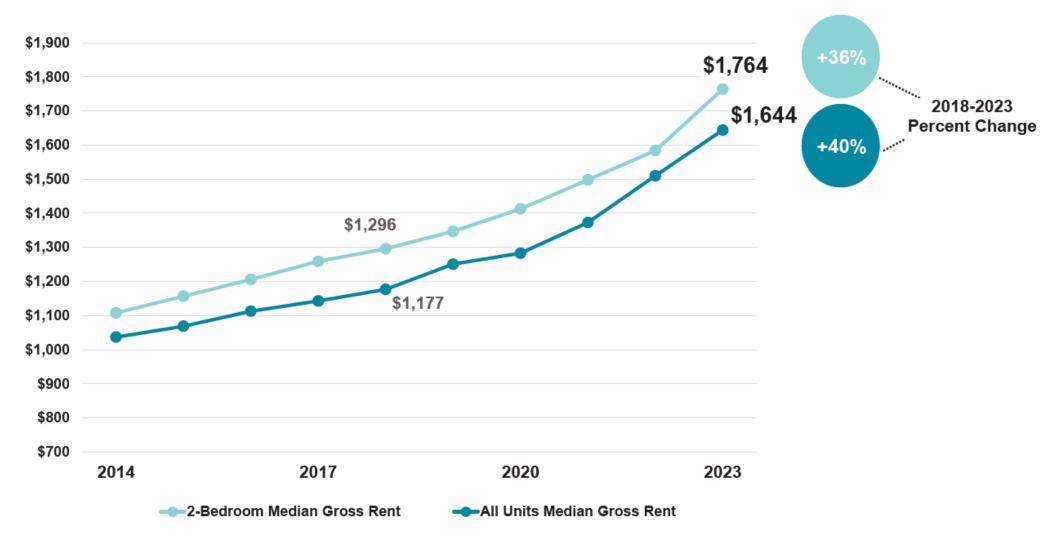


2023 RESIDENTIAL RENTAL COST SURVEY





MEDIAN GROSS RENTAL COST



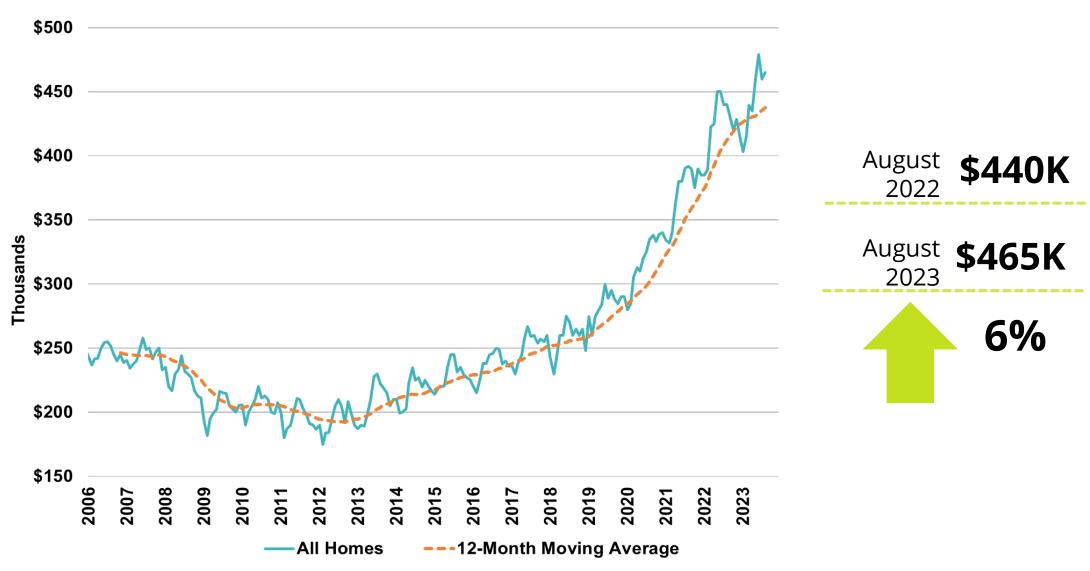


INTEREST RATES





SINGLE-FAMILY MEDIAN SALES PRICE

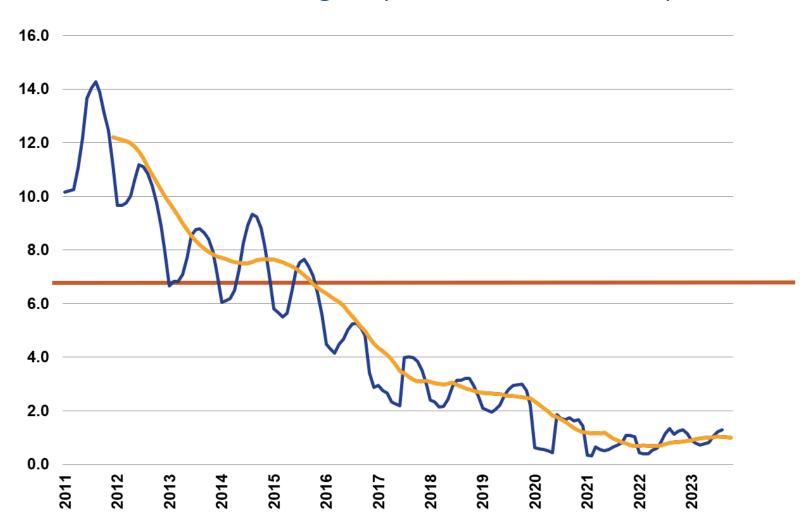

Months to absorb active listings at prior 12 months' sales pace



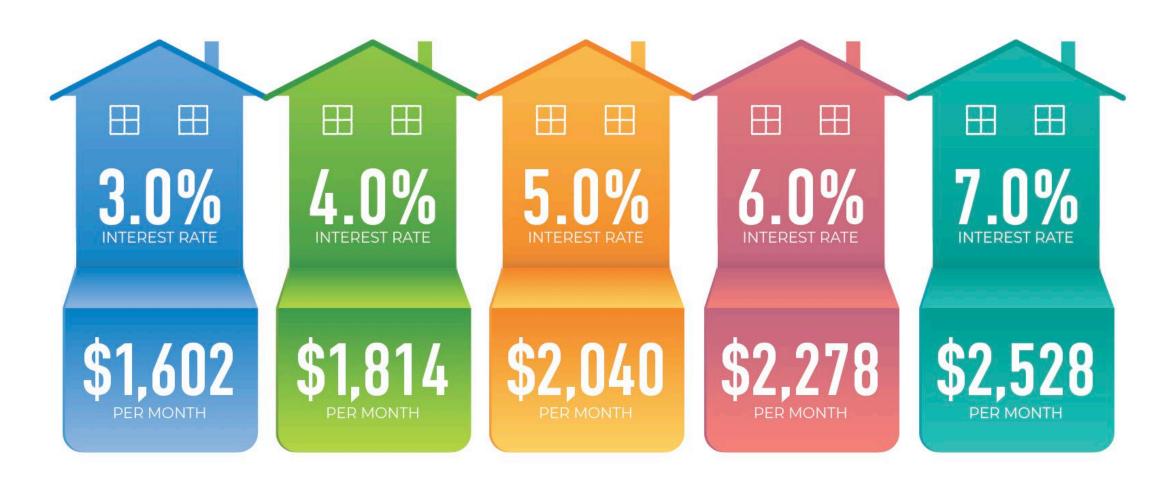
Inventory shortage has the greatest impact at the lower end of the market

LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY TO SUPPORT HOUSING SOLUTIONS

Progress in 2023

- Affordable Housing Fund \$25 million one-time appropriation
- InvestNH \$10 million
- Housing Champions Designation for municipalities that adopt housing-friendly policies – eligibility for other funding

Coming up in 2024 Session

- Special House Committee on Housing bills on ADUs, permitting reform, septic systems, and others
- Affordable Housing Fund increase to the \$5M annual appropriation
- Historic Housing Preservation Tax Credit

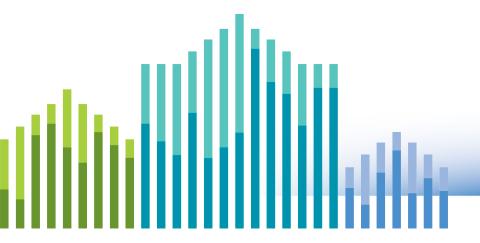
